Background:

As you are well aware, Kim Rowley has been appointed, by Council, as the Returning Officer for the 2020 municipal election. In prior years, the Returning Officer would have been supported by municipal staff. In 2016, Chris Frotten, and in 2012, Alyssa LeBlanc. Both would have acted in the capacity of revising the voting lists, deleting and adding voters as the campaigns unfolded. Other tasks included general support for nomination papers, research and any other services the Returning Officer may need more support. In the past, we did not appoint a Deputy Returning Officer, and probably should have.

Lori Murphy was designated as that support person, which she willingly accepted.

MGA considerations:
