

YARMOUTH COUNTY REGIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATION (REMO)

DROUGHT PLAN (Revised September 7, 2021)

TRIGGERS to Activation of Drought Plan:

- 1. Drought conditions that result in at least 25-30% of on-site domestic dry wells throughout the County.
- 2. No significant predicted precipitation by Environment Canada in the next 60 days.
- 3. Requests from residents to Fire Departments for non-potable water.
- 4. Yarmouth County Fire Departments indicating low levels of water in fire ponds.
- 5. Requests to the Municipalities with assistance for both potable and non-potable water.
- 6. Town of Yarmouth Water Utility identifies concerning levels.
- 7. Surrounding areas (outside Yarmouth County) experiencing similar drought conditions.
- 8. Yarmouth County and surrounding areas under high to extreme drought warning as measured by the Department of Lands and Forest. Fire Index high to extreme.
- 9. Conservation of water requested by Municipal officials.

REMO YARMOUTH COUNTY: ASSUMPTIONS

This Drought Plan is based on the assumption that local Municipalities will be promoting on site solutions for residents of Yarmouth County who are experiencing a lack of water in their wells due to very dry weather conditions.

The Municipality of the Districts of Yarmouth and Argyle are presently providing financial loans through their 'Water Supply Lending Programs' to residents in the County who, because of drought conditions, are requesting assistance to either upgrade their existing well or dig/drill a new well. This Drought Plan focuses on the assumption that the Municipalities will continue this Program as well as work towards the possibility of providing other water security to residents and receiving support from the province.

Following this Drought Plan, REMO will only be providing drinking water to those residents who are referred by Provincial and Municipal agencies who work with residents in existing programs and demonstrate a need for assistance. REMO will have drinking water on hand on a yearly basis to supply water to these residents. Drinking water will be stored at the Ground Search and Rescue Building in Arcadia.

REMO will be responsible for publication of information on water conservation, water safety, testing and water security on its website and other social media when drought conditions are becoming apparent.

Below is the Operational Plan that REMO and the Municipalities will follow:
