**BY-LAW NO. 42 – ALTERNATIVE VOTING BY-LAW**

In accordance with Section 169 of the Municipal Government Act, notice is hereby given that the Barrington Municipal Council at their meeting held March 28, 2023, gave second and final reading to the adoption of By-law No. 42—Alternative Voting By-law.

This by-law makes provision for Alternative Voting on Advance Polling Days and on Ordinary Polling Day where Council has passed a resolution permitting one or more forms of Alternative Voting for an Election. Alternative Voting means voting by telephone or via the internet and includes a combination of telephone and internet voting.

The by-law may be inspected at the Municipal Office located at 2447 Hwy 3, Barrington, N.S., between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday.

By-law No. 42—Alternative Voting By-law will become effective on the date of this publication.

**NOTICE - PUBLIC HEARING**

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO LAND USE BY-LAW RE: AGRICULTURAL USES**

In accordance with Section 206 (1) of the Municipal Government Act, the Council of the Municipality of the District of Barrington intends to hold a Public Hearing to consider proposed amendments to the Municipal Land Use By-law relating to agricultural uses. Proposed amendments will clarify and strengthen current regulations relating to agricultural uses such as differentiating between agriculture activity which is accessory to a main residential use versus primary use of land and standards for various types of agricultural activities and structures. As a result of the Public Hearing held May 24, 2022, proposed amendments to this by-law have been revised to require a minimum lot area of 1 acre as opposed to the 10 acres previous recommended. Some definitions have also been revised.

Proposed amendments may be viewed by interested persons between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, excluding holidays, at the Municipal Office, in the Administrative Centre, Civic No. 2447, Highway 3, Barrington, NS.

Any representation by interested persons concerning these matters may be made at the Public Hearing of Council to be held in the Council Chambers, in the Administrative Centre, in Barrington, on Tuesday April 25, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.
