## 1. Call Meeting to Order

#### 4. Presentation – YASTA – Neil MacKenzie

Neil MacKenzie, CEO for YASTA was present to speak to Council about what YASTA does. YASTA was founded by the Municipality of Argyle, Municipality of Yarmouth, and Town of Yarmouth. YASTA works on marketing, business development, event attraction, and destination advocacy and support to grow tourism.

Neil provided Council with an update on the Room Marketing Levy.

### 10. 7-Day Notice to Council

#### a. Article P8 - Holidays

Deputy CAO Surette brought forward the amendment to Article P8 – Holidays for 7-day notice. The change being proposed in this policy is adding a section outlining how employees qualify for holiday pay.

#### b. Article P12 - Leave for Blood Donation

Article P12 – Leave for Blood Donation is being brought forward to allow all employees, rather than just full-time employees to have leave for blood donation. It also amends the maximum number of times to go in one fiscal year from four time to two times.
