c. Capital Investment Plan

The CAO explained that the Capital Investment Plan is a five-year guide for major projects, based on a master list that includes both new builds and repairs. Staff handles the technical side - costs, funding, and timelines - while council decides which projects to prioritize. A working session will be held this fall to review priorities and how new projects are added. The plan outlines about \$19 million in projected funding over five years, including \$7.4 million from municipal reserves, with major projects like the Mariners Centre Expansion and Ice Pad Replacement, and potential new pathways depending on outside funding. Council also discussed the conditional Yarmouth Curling Club contribution and agreed to follow up. A discussion was had on the point-based system and council asked to see the criteria used.

It is MOVED by Councillor Glenn Diggdon and SECONDED by Councillor Kathy Bourque that the 5-year Capital Investment Plan for the years ending March 31, 2026-2030 be approved as presented.
